

Massillon Museum to debut 3-D timeline in the Paul Brown Museum

The Massillon Museum, 121 Lincoln Way E, will debut a 3-D timeline in the Paul Brown Museum at 9:30 a.m. Feb. 1.

The new 8- by 30-foot timeline details Paul Brown's life, career and accomplishments and the history of the professional Massillon Tigers and the Massillon Washington High School football program from 1891 through today. The timeline was designed by Innis Maggiore using images, research and artifacts provided by museum staff.

Among the artifacts included in the timeline are Paul Brown's famous fedora and his Hall of Fame gold jacket. Visitors can see the 1940 Massillon-McKinley game ball, signed by all the players on what is often considered to be the greatest team in high school football history. The baton carried by South Rampart Street Parade majorette Ann Antoinette Anastasia Anania can be seen alongside a photo of Ananina in costume.

Two additional new exhibitions can be seen on Feb. 1 in the Paul Brown Museum: Massillon's Gridirons and Paul Brown's Professional Teams. Both will continue through July 5.
